Speaking Test

Auf den folgenden Seiten finden Sie allgemeine Informationen, Hilfen und Übungen zum **Speaking Test bei der Abschlussprüfung in Englisch**.

Die Prüfung wird zusammen mit einem/einer Mitschüler/-in aus der Klasse abgelegt. Die Partner/-innen werden ausgelost. Erst am Prüfungstag wird bekanntgegeben, mit wem man die Prüfung macht.

Die Prüfung besteht aus drei Teilen von jeweils 4 Minuten.

Part I:

In Part I unterhalten sich die Lernenden über ein gestelltes Thema. Wenn die beiden Partner/-innen mit ihrem Gespräch die Zeit nicht ausfüllen können, besteht die Möglichkeit, ein zweites Thema zu bekommen. Darüber müssen sich beide Partner/-innen einig sein und den/die Prüfer/-in von sich aus ansprechen. Nachdem ein zweites Thema gestellt wurde, kann nicht mehr zum ersten Thema zurückgekehrt werden.

Part II:

In Part II findet kein Dialog zwischen den Partnern/-innen statt.

Jeder/jede Schüler/-in bekommt zwei Bilder, die verglichen werden müssen. Dabei soll sowohl auf Gemeinsamkeiten als auch auf Unterschiede eingegangen werden. Es genügt nicht, die Bilder nur zu beschreiben. Dafür ist ca. eine Minute vorgesehen.

Anschließend gibt es eine Frage, die sich auf die Thematik der Bilder bezieht. Für die Beantwortung steht ungefähr eine Minute zur Verfügung.

Part III:

In Part III wird eine Situation geschildert, zu der eine ergebnisorientierte Diskussion stattfindet. Es stehen Bildimpulse zur Verfügung, die als Grundlage für das Gespräch dienen. Die Bildvorschläge müssen nicht unbedingt alle besprochen werden, auch eigene Gedanken dürfen in das Gespräch einfließen.

Informationen zur Bewertung:

Es werden einerseits die Aussprache sowie Ihr verwendeter Wortschatz und die Grammatik bewertet. Dabei ist zwar sprachliche Korrektheit wichtig, doch sollte auch eine gewisse Bandbreite an Vokabular und grammatischen Strukturen gezeigt werden. Positiv beurteilt wird darüber hinaus die Fähigkeit, möglicherweise fehlendes Vokabular zu kompensieren (z. B. durch Definitionen oder Umschreibungen).

Andererseits fließt in die Bewertung ein, wie Sie das Gespräch führen (Anbahnung und Aufrechterhaltung des Gesprächs, aufmerksames Zuhören und angemessene Reaktionen auf Beiträge des Gegenübers, gemeinsames Finden einer Lösung) und wie gewinnbringend Ihre Äußerungen für das Gespräch sind.
